Welcome (Sue Dennison)

• Sue welcomed everyone and invited them to introduce themselves, provided an overview of meeting, and introduced Provost Storrs

State of the University Presentation by Provost Debbie Storrs followed by Q&A

- <u>Provost Storrs</u> came to UNCG in July 2021. She is originally from Alaska, and has a Masters and Ph.D. in Sociology from Univ. of Oregon. Taught at Univ of Idaho and then to administrative positions at the Univ. of North Dakota.
- <u>Highlights of 2021/2022</u>: 49 faculty promoted and/or tenured; \$48.4 million in research funding; acknowledged efforts of faculty adjusting to teach UNCG students during the pandemic, including involving students in research.
- <u>Enrollment:</u> Decline in undergraduate enrollment can be attributed to COVID, ACT/SAT test optional allows students more choices of schools, decline in transfer student, and national demographic trends. UNCG enrolled students remain diverse (e.g., first-generation students, students of color, Pell eligible).
- UNCG noted for promoting social mobility: #1 in NC and #13 in the US.
- <u>Concerns about students:</u> Lack of preparedness for higher education, less engagement, and lowhigh sschool GPAs, which are effects of COVID.
- <u>Budget reductions</u>: Reductions were strategic (not across the board) based on core values, strategic priorities; included merging ITS/IR and shifting responsibilities from UNCG Online to other units.
- New program investments: Addiction Sciences curriculum (including 4 new faculty lines) and Assistant Director for Diverse Student Engagement, plus new program/curriculum in eSports.
- Enhanced recruitment activities and Integrated Retention Plans are underway and will continue.
- <u>Future plans</u>: focus on integrated student success; initiate a new QEP plan; new enrollment funding model to be led by the Chancellor along with transformation planning; Chancellor is advocating for some flexibility for performance metrics with UNCG Board of Governors and the NC Legislature; new Provost Fellows to work on target issues.
- Responses to Q&A:
 - o Addiction Sciences will be organized as an institute or a center. It is a graduate program.
 - Status of Professional Track Faculty: Provost Storrs would like to see multiple year contracts in the future; Provost's office will fund promotions for PTFs; current multiple year contracts have been honored for current PTFs and new hires.
 - In response to Jerry's question, Provost Storrs believes we need to double down on retention (e.g., UNCG asked for \$9 million for Student Success); help faculty to understand our current students so they can better engage them; not abandon our graduate programs but look at them strategically; initiate new undergraduate programs and determine low demand programs to eliminate;
 - Kitty Hawk initiative funded by legislature to provide online education to anyone in NC, which we
 could partner with for some of our programs/degrees especially to tap into the market of working
 adult students
 - ROI study also funded by legislature to do a Return On Investment study to evaluate every program
